For more than 100 years, The University of Texas at El Paso has been an integral part of the Paso del Norte landscape. Throughout our remarkable history, we have built lasting partnerships with visionaries who share our commitment to ensure that all young people in our culturally diverse region have authentic opportunities for access and excellence.

UTEP's enrollment continues to grow: this year we set another record with 25,151 students. Notably, more than 80% of all UTEP students come from area high schools, and we are attracting the area's "best and brightest" high school graduates: each year more than half of all this region's Top Ten Percent high school graduates who attend public universities in Texas enroll at UTEP.

Once on campus, students at UTEP find meaningful and intentionally constructed

pathways designed to help them attain their highest aspirations. Expanded research, exceptional faculty and staff, and innovative programs are at the core of our academic infrastructure, and federal, state and corporate partners have generously augmented our work through a total of more than 500 currently active grants valued at more than \$300 million. Our private partners further contributed to our progress in FY2018 with nearly \$7 million in support for endowments, scholarships and a variety of campus initiatives.

I am proud to say that UTEP's success is also measured by the past year's record number of 4,842 graduates who now call themselves Miner alumni. The total number of UTEP graduates has more than doubled over the past 20 years.












Where UTEP Graduates are Working


UTEP FY 2018 Sources of Revenue

Under her leadership, UTEP has earned national and international acclaim for successfully preparing students to compete in a global economy, pursue graduate studies, conduct world-class research, and give back to their communities and the nation.

UTEP's deep commitment to our historically underserved student demographic has had a profound impact on enrollment, increasing our student population by 78 percent since President Natalicio took the helm in 1988. Today, the University's more than 25,000 students accurately reflect the demographics of the Paso del Norte region, validating our strong conviction that talent resides everywhere.

As a result of visionary strategic planning, the number of doctoral programs increased from 1 to 22 and the number of doctoral students from 16 to 921. Our robust research agenda has grown from \$2.6 million to \$95 million in annual expenditures, the number of full-time faculty positions has more than doubled to support an ever growing student population and new state-of-the-art facilities have transformed UTEP's campus climate to ensure students' access to academic and personal development experiences that prepare them to compete successfully with their peers anywhere across the globe.
